2. Narratives:

TESDA-LNNAIS implemented a five-day joint Upskilling in Food Processing NC II last January 13-17, 2025 at its Main Campus in Brgy. Bualan, Tubod, Lanao del Norte. This event aimed to foster a culture of continuous learning and improvement among students and employees. The participants **(17 Males, 20 Females)** are composite of 21 second-year students of Diploma in Animal Science Technology (DAST) (13 Males, 8 Females), and 16 school faculty and staff (4 Males, 12 Females).

Ms. Queeny Twinkle N. Enyong, the technical expert of Food Processing NC II, facilitated the online (2 days) sessions via Google classroom, and face-to-face sessions (3 days). The participants **(17 Males, 20 Females)** were tasked with activities in preparing required tools/materials/equipment, preparing raw materials, perform processing techniques, packaging finished processed products, and performing post-production activities. All participants **(17 Males, 20 Females)** completed the upskilling program.

The upskilling in Food Processing NC II had a 100% completion rate.



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The 21 second-year students of DAST, and 15 school personnel were endorsed to undergo the national assessment. One faculty completer was advised to refrain from taking the national assessment due to health concerns.

Ms. Ethel Dyane L. Quimiguing, competency assessor, conducted the national assessment on Food Processing NC II to 36 candidates (**17 Males, 19 Females**) January 15, 16, 25, and 26, 2025 at LNN AIS Main Campus. All candidates received “Competent” remarks.

The Food Processing NC II national assessment had a 100% passing rate.
